- 1. What does 1:8-9 imply about the manner in which wisdom was taught?
- 2. How would you characterize the lure of becoming a thief as Solomon depicts it in 1:10-19?
- 3. What is the reality of the thief's situation?
- 4. If you were to give your child advice on practical living, where would you start?
- 5. Perhaps the easiest and most common excuse for falling into trouble is ignorance, *I didn't know any better*. What does 1:20-21 imply about the validity of this excuse?
- 6. What is wisdom offering? to whom? at what cost?
- 7. According to wisdom as personified in 1:20-33, why is it that people find themselves in need of wisdom but are unable to find it? How can we fall prey to this trap?
